Cross that bridge

A new bridge in the Scrase Valley Local Nature Reserve has widened the crossing over a stream, making it easier for disabled residents and parents with buggies to cross the water. The new bridge has been built by Mid Sussex District Council and forms part of a path that runs through the Scrase Valley Local Nature Reserve. It is a key walkway linking Lindfield and Haywards Heath (south of Backwoods Lane) and the path is heavily used by many local residents, including schoolchildren and local shoppers.

The new bridge was formally opened by Mid Sussex District Council Chairman, Councillor Mandy Thomas-Atkin, on Tuesday 11 October 2011. It is wider and has tarmac ramps at either side so is far more accessible for those who want to enjoy the beauty of the reserve using a wheelchair. Local resident Colin Carter is a regular user of the path and he welcomes the improvements that the new bridge has made. "It's so much better than it was; the new bridge is much wider and it's now really easy for wheelchair users like me to access." said Colin.

Swim-a-long 'a great success'

Swimmers of all ages and abilities donned their hats and goggles for a gala swimming event for St Peter & St James Hospice based in North Chailey. The Swimalong took place in October at The Triangle Leisure Centre, where participants swam as many lengths as they could in 50 minutes as an individual or as a team. It is hoped that the final sum raised for the local charity will be over £2000.

Have your say on the District Plan

Mid Sussex District Council, in partnership with the Town and Parish Councils, has been working on a Mid Sussex District Plan. The role of the Plan is to say broadly what, where, when and how development will take place in Mid Sussex over the next 20 years.

The draft District Plan aims to encourage the local economy and helps to promote the health and vitality of Mid Sussex towns and village centres. It seeks to ensure the Council has planning policies in place that will protect the distinctive characters of its towns and villages as well as the beautiful countryside across the District. It proposes a significant reduction in the level of new housing to be built in Mid Sussex over the next 20 years, when compared to the figures in the South East Plan.

The consultation is open to all who are interested and will run until 13th January 2012. The draft District Plan and information about the consultation are available to view at the Town/ Parish Council office, at all the district libraries and help-points or online at www.midsussex. gov.uk/districtplan. Comments can be submitted online at the same address or can be sent to Planning Policy and Economic Development, Mid Sussex District Council at Oaklands, Oaklands Road, Haywards Heath, West Sussex, RH16 1SS. All comments received will be public information.

Lindfield holds no end of hidden treasures, not least to the average shopper or passer by. In the second of our two-part series we stroll up the High Street, this month the West side, to see what you can expect to find in the shops.

We begin the mission walking past the Pond on our left and taking in the vista of the widest section of the High Street. A small parade of shops starts us off (once all owned by the locally well-known Masters family); the first is Full Spectrum run by Susan & Nigel Hutchings. This quaint little space is home to all manner of herbal and homeopathic remedies that you can buy off-the-shelf. As well as plenty of advice on those and stress management, their catchphrase is 'get better, feel better'.

In a similar vein Selbys is a pharmacy name long associated with Lindfield, and they are always happy to help. Whether it's a sore throat, an emergency bag of nappies, Christmas gifts or even holiday travel advice, it seems that Selbys has it covered.

Our next store I first remember as 'International' (and, I dare say, many readers can remember back further!), but today The Co-operative is an excellent resource for the village, with its extended open hours proving helpful to many. The large posters adorn the windows inform us of their latest offers and it looks as if there's a good selection of Christmas treats and biscuits inside!

On the corner of Denmans Lane comes Leaf, a ladieswear and knitwear retailer offering a good range of clothes and accessories for ladies over 30. The garments are clearly excellent quality and the team give great customer service and advice too, but only when asked! Elaine or any of the other ladies will be pleased to help.

At this point we take a slight excursion from the main road to explore three shops tucked away from view. Lindfield Dry Cleaners is on the corner (next to the Parish Council) and always has that lovely fresh smell when you open the door! World Coffees roasts and grinds its own coffee beans imported from over 15 countries. I know there are many regulars who won't buy from anywhere else! You can also now order online, by phone or email. Lastly in this area, Happy Feet is a kids shoe shop. Inside it is decorated by Crocs of all colours, school shoes and some amazingly fun-looking wellies. My favourites are the Ladybird boots!

If it's fun you are after, then look no further than Bliss! There are five stylists in this hairdressers for both ladies and gents, and its certainly got a buzz going on. They even promise to dress up on Christmas Eve, so be sure to pop your head in if you don't believe me.

As I walk into Field & Forrest, Lindfield's newest delicatessen, I can see a couple drinking hot chocolate in the window (available as takeaway too!), a gentleman choosing from the selection of cheeses and a great looking special bonfire cupcake on the counter. But there is loads more including olives, monetzumas chocolate and pasta too.

The Stand Up Inn seems like it is where many stories of the village begin and end. It's certainly a popular establishment for locals and the odd dog too. The venue is particularly crowded on music



nights, when bands play in what feels like a very traditional pub atmosphere. The Dark Star Brewery now runs the pub, featuring their own range plus other beers and ciders.

Next up is Green Elliott & Crowe, where Alison and Michael Crowe run a small and friendly optician's and have done for nearly 16 years. In addition to the many designer frames on display they cater for all tastes and pockets, plus they are also one of the few opticians who will carry out home visits for those unable to get out into the village.

Adjoining here is the Lindfield office of Mansell McTaggart Estate Agents, whose windows are always hard not to look at out of idle curiosity. They are also the main agents for The Limes development off Newton Road. Personally I still can't help but think of Durrant's Coffee House when I go inside this building but maybe that's just me!

Continuing up the High Street, past the path to the Doctor's surgery, we arrive at Villandry Home. This shop always has a lovely window display with some really interesting pieces on show. Inside it smells beautiful, courtesy of Dr Vranjes I understand. Sarah sells a good range of homewares, lighting decoration and furniture pieces.

Next door we find ourselves in some highly desirable kitchens at The Kitchen People. They are designers of middle/high end production kitchens and will come out to you to do a free site survey. With over 80 per cent of their business from referrals, they clearly have a lot of happy customers in the locality.

Moving up past a few houses, we come across the stone steps of Humphreys bakery. It's a familiar sight to find a quickly moving queue of hungry souls outside this traditional bakers of fresh bread and cakes. And it's always hard not to join on the end when passing!

Limes of Lindfield is now well established in the village, although has actually only been around for just over five years. Chris & Jo White run the bistro, which also has two luxury apartments above. The restaurant has recently welcomed new head chef Kevin Jones, previously at Alexander House Hotel.

Next on our left is Peter Voigt Ltd at No 71. The window display boasts that the

family have been violin makers since 1699 and the note on the door gives some indication of the personal service you'd receive here: "Sometimes we are in when it says closed, sometimes we are not when it says open. Always try the door."

Outside Tufnells, a lovely shop for gifts, I am reminded that everyone I know seems to have a Thomas Kent clock at the moment! But there is loads more in this 'Aladdin's cave' of a place, now with a Christmas Room open for festive purchases.

Denziloe is a hairdressers with great customer service and a cup of tea at the ready. Plus the added benefit for customers of the view through the windows out to the High Street.

Moving further up is Kieron James Toys in which there is always a friendly face to greet you (and I'm not talking about the toy giraffe in the window!). Here he stocks over 300 different toys from traditional wooden to Nerf mega howler balls. I saw Elise checking out the dolls and soft toy ranges.

Next door Martin's provides a sterling newsagent and delivery service plus, if you're feeling lucky, maybe a lottery ticket too!

Abbott's Pharmacy, with its traditional black and gold signwriting, provides advice to its customers from behind the counter plus it boasts an extensive range of organic products and a health food store packed with gluten and diary free alternatives. An excellent resource to have on our doorstep.

We make our way up to the last shop in our tour, it's Doodie Stark, a fashion boutique which has recently been extended to expand its offer. The store has a sophisticated style about it, along with a nice mix of soft and hard interior finishes. It's clear this is a highly regarded store, as I overhear a 'regular' becoming almost giddy at the new line of reasonably priced jewellery on display in the counter.

It is easy to forget just what we do have here in Lindfield. But, if we have learnt nothing else from this High Street shopping tour, we should have seen what a great variety of thriving shops we have on hand. Some we use everyday, others we save for something special. Why not start your Christmas shopping in Lindfield this year?



Look lively, Lindfield's lacking Lollipop Ladies!

"It is an accident waiting to happen," a number of concerned parents all agree as we stand at the top of School Lane watching the traffic rolling past us with no school crossing patrollers to keep the children safe.

I walked down to Lindfield Primary school this morning to discover just how dangerous the situation has become and I found myself waiting, for what seemed like hours, to simply cross the road. How parents and school children have the patience to cross this road every morning is a mystery to me. You may think I'm being ridiculous but you have only to observe one morning to see just how hazardous the roads are.

I talked to Amanda Harries; a spirited parent enthusiastic about the need for a new school crossing patrol. "It is absolutely lethal without a lollipop lady. If you have got someone out there in a bright yellow jacket people do slow down," she campaigned and, like Amanda, many if not all of the other parents taking their children to school are not happy as things stand.

We watched the cars jammed at the small junction off the High Street and speeding past the children taking their first steps onto the road. Another worried parent pointed to the roadside, "People are parking along the road which then obstructs the view to cross. It is so dangerous."

The top of Backwoods Lane, previous lollipop lady

Karen Kempshall "heroically patrolled," has been 'lollipopless' since September. I spoke to Karen who regrettably left after seven years at the post. "It was the best job ever, everyone was so nice," she insisted without a doubt. "For people to say I was a big part of the community means an awful lot. I feel so proud, it was such a great job."

Karen added, "I spent my first day trying to hide behind the pole, I was so nervous! But I soon fell in love with the job." When I asked Karen what she would say to anyone thinking about taking the position she devotedly replied, "Just go for it! Even in the rain and the snow it is the still the most rewarding job. Sure, you get wet, you look like a drowned rat but none of that matters. It is so worth it."

Karen has been an outstanding attribute to our village, just as the other school crossing patrollers have been. I found it incredible that there are 130 sites where school crossing patrols are employed in West Sussex yet we are finding it so difficult to recruit someone for our area in desperate need. A team of 21 volunteers, nearly all from Lindfield's All Saints Church, recently returned to Romania to continue the work begun in 2010 of building homes for young families and single people who spent a number of years in the care of Caminul Felix foster-homes. (Caminul Felix means happy home in Romanian).

The volunteers turned their hands to a whole variety of tasks including mixing concrete, screeding floors, painting, shovelling sand, pushing wheelbarrows and climbing ladders. Some of the volunteers were skilled professionals, some amateur decorators and others had never picked up a paintbrush before and not only did they learn new skills but they also got to know each other while working on the houses.

Although some of the tasks seemed a bit daunting, when everyone worked together the results were amazing and by the end of the week a boiler house had been built, a porch insulated, a guest house painted, the entire ground floor of a house screeded and the base of another house laid.

Following the first visit in 2010 two of the houses that the group helped to build then are now homes to young families. As a screed was being applied to the floor of one of the houses being built this year, its future owner told us "This is a dream come true."

After working hard all week the team had a rest on Friday and visited Casa Minunata – a school for disabled children and Terra Nova a prosthetics laboratory. Both facilities were started and are supported by Caminul Felix. Time was also spent going into the mountains of Transylvania where they visited the "Bear Cave".

Team member Lindsay Norris commented: "Having seen the positive effect of our previous work, we hope to go back in 2012 to build more houses and see who is living in the houses we helped to build this year."





GOLF TIP OF THE MONTH #1

The greenside bunker shot.

This shot is about precision and accuracy of strike...
If you try and remove the entire contents of the bunker onto the green in one swing, there will be little control in your shot... Play the ball forward in the stance (towards the left

heel), set your weight and hands behind the ball, open your stance a little (to the left) and club-face (to the right) in the set-up. This will encourage the club to sweep through the sand and use the natural bounce of your sand wedge. The ideal bunker shot will produce a shallow splash shot, eliminating hitting too much sand and thinned-shots. Perfect this technique and you'll see a high soft landing shot, with a small amount of sand removed from the bunker... Job Done...!





Despite its humble beginnings during the midst of the recession, lan Wells had a dream to create a computer repair company that set the standard in customer service, accountability and value.


SPROUTS WITH A DIFFERENCE

Cook the sprouts until just tender. Drain well (can be done ahead of time). Meanwhile gently cook thinly sliced onion in butter until golden brown, stir in "roasted and ready-to-use" chestnuts (vacuum packed) and the sprouts and cook, stirring, until piping hot.

Cook sprouts as above. Gently cook a thinly sliced onion in olive oil until just soft. Add a little more oil (to make the dressing), the sprouts, handful of shelled pistachios or hazelnuts and 2-3 tbs fresh lemon juice. Heat just until piping hot.

LEMON TARTS

Whisk 3tbs good quality lemon curd with 150g mascarpone cheese until light and fluffy. Use to fill mini croustade cases, pre-baked shortcrust tart shells or brandy snap baskets. Decorate with toasted flaked almonds or candied fruit. Don't fill more than an hour before serving otherwise the shells will soften. Excellent as a sponge cake filling too.

Just where has this year gone to? It seems like only last month I was writing about spring vegetables and salads! Now we want steaming hot bowls of soup and casseroles and, of course, Christmas is looming on the horizon. For most people the Christmas Day meal has to be the traditional one and I think it is great we keep it that way. However I thought you might like some fresh ideas on the other dishes apart from the bird. After all, there are thirty other days in December when we want to eat.

SCALLOPED POTATOES

Scalloped potatoes (potatoes au gratin) are simply thinly-sliced potatoes layered with onions, covered with a creamy seasoned mixture and baked until they are very soft and have a crisp golden brown top. Very simple to put together, they can be varied in many numerous ways plus they can also be cooked very successfully in the microwave (perhaps freeing up the oven for another dish). Here is the basic recipe for four generous servings:

Preheat the oven to 190°. Peel and very thinly slice 700g baking potatoes and 1 large onion. Using a large pan, gently cook the onion with a generous knob of butter over low heat until soft but not brown. Stir in 1-2 crushed garlic cloves and 300ml single or whipping cream. Heat just until bubbles appear around the edge. Add the potato slices and stir to coat with the cream and onions. Spoon evenly into a buttered shallow baking dish and level the top. Bake for 25-30 min or until soft throughout when tested with a fork and the top is

golden brown. Allow to rest for 10 min before cutting into portions.

Variations: use leeks in place of the onions. Or spoon half the potato mixture into the dish, sprinkle with grated cheese and/or chopped ham, top with remaining potatoes and finally more grated cheese (Gruyere is good as is mature or smoked Cheddar). Or just sprinkle the top with grated cheese. Or use 350g potatoes and 350g of carrots, celeriac, fennel or parsnips, all thinly sliced.

Microwave method: prepare the dish as above. Cook on MEDIUM for about 15 min (800 watt oven)until soft throughout. Place under a hot grill until golden brown. All these recipes are good served alone or with roast, grilled or cold meats or fish.

Have a delicious Christmas.

It's a wrap!

Since this time of year is always especially busy for HomeSmiths I do try and get myself organised early. Whilst I could leave the wrapping for the week before Christmas, those magical days are something I prefer, if possible, to savour and enjoy with the family. I also happen to find wrapping presents incredibly therapeutic. My theme for wrapping is largely defined by my tree scheme, which in turn is dictated to a certain extent by the wall colour in my dining room, a need for colour coordination which I am ribbed about but make no excuses for.

When wrapping gifts I like to use ribbon only with a patterned paper and then more of a feature trimming with a plain wrap. I am always on the lookout for new approaches to gift wrapping and here are some of the ideas I have come across this season.

As a child those DIY doylies or paper snowflakes signalled for me, along with the dry mouth effect of licking and sticking paper chains, the beginning of Christmas. I would borrow my mother's nail scissors and get busy with a pile of discarded computer paper from my father's office, plastering my windows with snowflakes and littering my bedroom floor with tiny Hoover-evading snippets of white paper. A single snowflake is a simple but really effective adornment for a gift, cut out in plain paper against a contrast plain or patterned wrap.

Conifer sprigs tied with ribbon make a pretty and scented gift trim, though I would suggest using these only for the Christmas Eve wrapping lest you end up with rather sad looking dried and curling brown twigs!

Wide strips of coloured paper can be used as ribbon and made even more interesting with a paper punch. It need not be fancy shape, a hole punch will do; you will still, by using a contrasting paper, achieve a great visual effect.

I recently spied a clever idea for larger gifts where the main paper is plain with the recipient's name cut out and stuck on in a contrast paper. The example I saw was sheet music cut up for the lettering on gold paper and it looked stunning. I like to recycle where I can. Most businesses generate reams of paper waste and it was an architect friend of mine who prompted me to use old plan drawings as wrap. Not appropriate for everyone perhaps but with a coloured ribbon it's an interesting aesthetic.

Children love creating their own papers. Potato print is a popular printing medium or simple hand drawings can look charming. My youngest saw the decorative potential of one of his drawings recently, using it to wrap up a fruit and nut bar for me as a "sorry for being a pickle" gift. He knew of course that I would find it hard to resist the treat and ignore the creativity!

Scaynes Hill Village Plan

Further to the completion and publication of the Scaynes Hill Village Plan there has been progress in various areas.

A support group has been established to support St Peter and St James Hospice, which is helping maintain the profile of the hospice and raise funds to support it.

As part of the refurbishment of the Farmers Inn, now renamed "The Inn on the Green", a Coffee Shop has been created and a Cash Machine has been installed.

The dog waste bins have been replaced with larger, better units.

The hedge in front of the Pond has been reduced in height and further work will be done on the pond shortly.

A group of residents are looking into sustainability. Using funds provided by the Spring Flower Show, bulbs have been planted to improve the village environment.

Enquiries have been made of Sussex Police with a view to restarting "Speed Watch", Volunteers please contact Councillor Steve Minter via the Parish Office.

In order to progress other areas of the Village Plan it requires individuals to come forward. In some cases the plan itself has proved a catalyst for change but in most cases it is up to YOU!

Fly Tipping on Gravelye Lane Allotment Gardens

At the allotment gardens on Gravelye Lane, Lindfield, an area has been set-aside for plotholders to place discarded foliage to be later incinerated, usually once or twice a year. It has been made quite clear that this area is for foliage that cannot be composted but there has always been an element of inappropriate material dumped on the site and the Council has made every effort to discourage this action.

Additionally there is evidence that household rubbish and other such material, including hazardous and non-burnable waste, has been brought in to the Allotments. The Parish Council regards this as fly tipping and takes a very dim view of this action.

As we know, fly tipping is a criminal offence and the parish council will take strong action against anyone found or suspected of fly tipping.

Community Connections

The Community Connections Directory of Services for Older People has been developed in partnership with organisations working with, and for, older people in Mid Sussex.

It provides easily accessible information about services for older people in the form of a Directory. This is distributed to older people themselves and to professionals (statutory and voluntary) working in the area. The Community Connections Directory of Services is also distributed to Help Points, Town and Parish Councils and other information points around the District.

The aim of the directory is to provide information about organisations which are here to help and forms part of the new Mid Sussex Wellbeing Service.

Mid Sussex Wellbeing is a 'one stop shop' for information and signposting to health and wellbeing services in Mid Sussex. The team includes a trained Wellbeing Advisor who can provide advice and guidance about leading a healthy lifestyle and staying well.



Managing Stress

NATURAL THERAPY

Managing stress is important at any time of year, as the less stressed you feel the better your mind and body will respond to what you need them to do. Christmas, whilst a time of joy, can also be a time of great stress so here are some ideas about how to manage stress.

1. Make time for yourself.

Many of us lead busy lives and can easily forget to focus on ourselves. It's important to take time out every day to spend time doing something for ourselves away from the pressures of everyday life. Some people may like to read a book, do some yoga, gardening or baking. Even if it is only 10 minutes sitting quietly on your own, taking this time out every day can have hugely beneficial effects.

2. Break tasks down into manageable chunks.

When we have a lot to do it can seem overwhelming, causing us to feel stressed. However, if we change the way we view tasks by breaking them down into smaller chunks we gain a sense of control over our situation and it promotes a sense of achievement.

However, because of human free-will and choice, the Angels can only intervene when asked. They see no difference between seemingly small issues and more life altering moments, though, so if finding a car parking space or gaining perspective on a relationship or career move helps replace stress with peace then ASK. The core of every question or issue, especially during times of change or suffering, is the deep human need to feel heard and supported.
