The Lindfield Country Market is held in King Edward Hall (KEH) every week and remains a popular place to buy gifts/produce and meet friends too.

The market started in 1965 as the local WI market trading from the garage of Ryecroft, the house next door to Lindfield United Reformed Church. Over the years it moved from there to KEH; first in the corridor next to the main hall, then moving into what is now the Newcombe Hall when the Jubilee Room was built after 1977.

The weekly market is not stallholders but one market

separated into product areas. The team of over 25 local small producers ensure that there is a good selection of cards, crafts, jumpers, cakes, pies, preserves and bulbs and plants for the garden. Sheila Hobbs, chairman, commented: "In February we begin to stock lots of goodies for your garden. Our plants sales are very popular and become very busy in the run up to the spring."

## Schools investigate Academy status

The University of Brighton has launched a new Academies Trust to support and sponsor schools in the Sussex area wishing to convert to academy status.

The university's plan has been approved by the Department for Education and the new Trust is already discussing the possibility with both Lindfield Primary School and Blackthorns Community Primary School.

As part of the consultation process, parents, carers, staff and members of local communities have been asked for their views on proposals agreed by the schools' governing bodies. This process has taken place and the two governing bodies are, at the time of going to print, yet to publish a decision to pass a resolution.

Although it is the same Trust the two schools are reaching decisions independently and no part of the proposal involves the schools merging in any way.

In the proposal documents circulated the date for conversion is stated as 1st April 2015. However, this date is subject to change depending on the schools internal consultation process.



## Rivers and Robots playing in Lindfield



It seemed like only last week that we were approaching the end of the traditional school summer holidays and being asked about our thoughts for the autumn market. Here we are already heading into February; the evenings are getting gradually lighter and the New Year's resolutions are a distant memory!

Early signs are that the traditional local property market will come to the fore this year, with many deciding that it's the right time to look for their next move, be it either upsizing or downsizing - one thing's certain - Lindfield is where people want to live!

#### Make sure you practise right

#### **TEEING OFF**

#### By James Verrall, Head Golf Professional

When you set your valuable time aside to practise your golf, it is important that you get the very most from it. This month we will look at the best ways to practise to achieve maximum results.

Quality is always more important than quantity. Try not to hit any more than 100 balls during one practice. You will find that you will begin to tire and this will affect your swing.

Always have a target!! If you do not choose something to aim for how do you know if it was a good shot? Try changing the target for different clubs, just like you would be doing on the course.

Start your practise with some half wedge shots. This gives your body a chance to warm up, no different to warming your body up for a gym session. Then work your way through the bag starting with your shortest club full swing (wedge) and working up to the longest one with full swing (driver). Again, like any good gym session, you need to warm down; finish your practise with half a dozen half wedge shots.

Try to avoid hitting your practice balls too quickly; it is important that you give yourself some time to reflect after each shot. Position your basket of balls far enough away so you need to leave your mat after each shot. A basket of 50 golf balls should take you 25 minutes. If you have finished after 10 then you probably have not got much from your practise.

Be realistic with your practise; remember that this is the time you can make mistakes. Don't give up on something your coach has said just because it has not worked for the first five or six shots.

For those of you who think practise is boring, then try using your imagination. Think about your favourite hole on the golf course and imagine you are hitting balls from different locations on the hole.

When young mum Terisa Tuffin visited Lindfield Nursery School she knew she had found the perfect place for her little boy. But little did she know that several years later she'd be the one welcoming the newcomers as the nursery's new owner. Terisa, who has run the nursery for the past six years, tells us why she loves living in the village, being part of the community and why she feels Lindfield is the perfect place to bring up a family.

Brought up in Burgess Hill, Terisa always dreamt of settling in Lindfield but that desire grew stronger after experiencing living in London and becoming a mum.

"I've always loved Lindfield," said Terisa who, after leaving school, trained as a veterinary nurse working at Mackie and Green in Haywards Heath. "I moved to London to continue my career as a vet nurse and experience living in a big city but when I became a mum I knew I had to get back to Sussex."

Terisa was delighted to find a house to rent on the High Street and immediately began to immerse herself in village life, swapping her work as a vet nurse for childcare.

"They say you should never work with children or animals but I've ended up doing both!" she laughed. Terisa enrolled her son Gabriel into Lindfield Nursery based at the King Edward Hall and in 2006 joined the staff as a nursery practitioner.

Two years later the opportunity arose for Terisa to take over. She jumped at the chance!  $\label{eq:chance}$ 

"Taking over such a well-established nursery was daunting," said Terisa. "I felt a huge sense of responsibility.

"But I've always had a passion for working with children and my staff are fabulous."

The nursery has always been based in the King Edward

Hall and, while the running of the group has changed over the years, the building has retained its familiar feel. "We were recently looking at some old photos of the nursery from the 70s and not a lot has changed," said Terisa. "Even the curtains are the same!

"It brings back lots of memories for our parents who came here as children and for one of our members of staff who came here too!

"Working in the King Edward Hall feels like we're in the very heart of the community and it's lovely to see all the other groups and activities coming and going during the week," said Terisa.

They include the weekly Country Market, where the nursery children are regular visitors. "The ladies who run the markets give the children such a lovely welcome."

Although teaching at the nursery has evolved to embrace new technology, ("the children are better at working the iPad than I am," says Terisa) the traditional nursery activities are still among the most popular. The children love playing with water, sand, building dens and story time.

"We also teach traditional games like hopscotch."

One of the most noticeable changes introduced by
Terisa is the uniform; distinctive purple sweatshirts
complete with logo. She has also had the outdoor area
'astro-turfed' so it can be used all year round.





People will often assume that we live in a perfectly decorated house, forever tempted by new fabric and wallpaper books and whimsically changing our sitting room scheme in line with the latest collection. Well, this never happens. First and foremost we are not frivolous and when I might have the time to ponder over our own decor, the busman's holiday rule kicks in and even choosing a paint colour can seem too much like 'work'. Yes I do, of course, come across fabrics and papers which I would love to use myself but the point is that I rarely get around to doing it. When we do work at home invariably something has forced our hand and then we find ourselves in the middle of it and having to make decisions. (Do as I say not as I do!). With clients I will pour hours into perfecting schemes but never afford myself the same time.

The first floor of our house has for the past year been much like one of those slider puzzles where you have to move a tile to create space for another to move and in doing so create the picture you want. 2014 was to be the year of 'the knock through' which, for Piers, was the year when we would turn two small rooms into one for him. This was not so straightforward since the rooms in question were at opposite ends of the house; our bedroom sat between one small room and our ensuite, on the other side of which was the second small room. We started by moving our ensuite to the adjacent small room, sealing up the old door, living for a day or two with a rather disconcerting 'sealed room' before knocking into our old ensuite from the other small room to create Piers' bedroom. That was all completed early summer followed on by our new ensuite, leaving us with a half finished bedroom. I was happy with this; we are always

extra busy in the autumn so it just did not feel like a priority. Piers, on the other hand, was most concerned to see the exposed floorboards where the fitted wardrobe once was and the gaps around the architrave into the new bathroom but it was warm, functional and worked well enough for us. Then our hand was forced. Our plasterer had a window in December where he could fit us in. Up to our eyes with pre-Christmas deadlines with clients - yes, why not? #### Road Wardens scheme needs volunteers

The scheme was founded many years ago by members of the three churches in Lindfield. The aim was to visit new residents and offer them a pack of local information. It is a simple but effective way to welcome people and helps to foster the community spirit that we enjoy and often, by making an initial contact in this way, a newcomer may feel encouraged to join in or explore what is on offer locally, thereby making new friends.

The scheme relies on volunteers who monitor the road where they live and watch for movement by word of mouth or 'For Sale' signs. In some areas it is only practical if several volunteers in a road look after a section of houses near to them. At present there are over 50 wardens but there are always roads without someone on the Road Wardens list leaving gaps.

The roads that are in need of coverage are: Appledore Gardens, Pelham Road, Noahs Ark Lane, part of William Allen Lane, The Hollow, Gravelye Lane, Rustlings Close, part of Fieldway and part of Brookway, Backwoods Close and West Common.

Did you know physiotherapy can help to shave off minutes from your running time, as well as prevent and treat injuries whilst training? Your running style is like your finger print, it is unique to you and we should all constantly try to improve our technique. Whether you're a sub-three hour marathon runner pushing for a new personal best, a Sunday jogger or just attempting your first run round the block, we can help.

With the New Year comes new year resolutions for some and for others it brings closer big running events, in particular Brighton and London marathons. Below are a few physiotherapy principles that I believe can shave minutes off your time and help keep you safe when running.

- 1. Love your feet. 40% of physios say people training for the marathon are wearing the wrong shoes. Make sure you go to a recognised running store to buy trainers. You should be able to use a treadmill or run outside to ensure trainers provide the right support for your gait before buying them.
- Adequate recovery period. You never overtrain, you
  always under recover. Recovery is the process that
  repairs the structural damage that occurs naturally
  when muscles are pushed. Cells in the muscle fibres
  degenerate and are replaced by new muscle cells
  that have a greater ability to cope with lactate and
  resistant fatigue, so don't forget to allow your body
  to recover and get stronger as a result.
- Cross train. A good support regime, such as Pilates and strength training, will improve muscular balance and help strengthen problematic areas such as hamstrings and glutes, as well as increasing flexibility and preventing tight legs.

4. Sports massage. A sports massage is good for general maintenance of the body and can speed up the recovery period by reducing tension and inflammation after harder training sessions. In addition, a quick and energetic massage technique can be used before an event to enhance the warm-up.

#### Tips to prevent injury

- Well planned training program a specific and personalised program not only takes pressure off the athlete trying to decide what to do, it helps achieve goals and objectives, sets rest days and allows specific areas of training to be worked on.
- Rest is as important to training development as training itself.
- A good Support regime running is only part of the puzzle. Doing support exercises such as Pilates, strength training, relaxation and stretching, such as yoga or a stretching class, will help keep injuries down.
- 4. Nutrition is necessary for peak performance and post-performance repair.
- Hydration water is an important nutrient for life because it helps regulate our temperature, lubricate our joints and transport nutrients throughout the body.

Finally, don't ignore telltale signs that you may be carrying an injury; it will only make the problem worse. Below I have listed the three main telltale signs:

- 1. Pain Is a good indicator that you may be carrying an injury. Time to seek advice from a physiotherapist.
- Slow recovery Areas of your body taking longer than usual to recover from sessions.
- 3. Poor performance during training or competition.

He added that Kate Moss and Gary Linekar were approached by Walliams himself.


"Our biggest challenge was casting all the children" said John. "We visited lots of youth clubs and drama classes, watched hundreds of tapes and auditioned dozens of young people.

Merging comedy and drama effectively is a deft art. Nicholls has been able to show this in his previous novels: 'Starter for Ten' and the high concept novel; 'One Day', showing a couple by seeing their stories every 15th July. Here, too, there is an idea which sets the story. Douglas has failed to realise his wife's discontent in their marriage. He knows that things are not as they should be, so he comes up with a plan which he thinks will bind his wife and son into the ideal family he thought he was living in. Do the Grand Tour of Europe – and the tourist experience will somehow cement the bonds of their relationships. Now when any of us think that any time is special – summer holiday or Christmas or New Year – then thinks that of itself will give the desired outcome. Actually, what Nicholls shows is that travel cannot broaden the mind but it can rip us apart. The fact that we can see the limitations of Douglas' personality and yet still find him a beguiling, entertaining character.

Many in the village go past the pond on a regular basis but, since Christmas, there has been a change on the landscape. Sadly, Lindfield has lost one of its flower shops. David Tingley went to meet the popular florist Khee Joon Kenneway to find out her story...

Khee Joon's story is one that begins in Singapore. One of eight children she was brought up in the little known area of Geylang, where she stayed until she met George, now her husband, while he was working there in the late 60s.

So Khee Joon (known as K J) had her first taste of Britain when they married and she came over in 1971. They owned a house in Aldershot, near Guildford, convenient for where George worked at the time. For the duration of the 80s the pair and 2 sons moved away to Singapore, living in the town of Clementi, when George's work as a marine engineer lecturer took them there. Then, in 1989, they moved back to UK with their three children. This time, with a job move for George, a colleague recommended looking around the Haywards Heath area for easy commuting. They took the advice and K J began her love affair with Lindfield!

Was moving from a country with tropical temperatures all year round to England's rather more fragile UK weather system a difficult choice? "Not for me," Khee Joon said. As we sit in her conservatory with the rain pouring down the glass, she simply says: "If it's raining, I try not to go out! England has always been good for me. I have felt so welcome here since the beginning and have formed many amazing friendships with Brits and others in a similar situation to me."

Within three days of moving to Lindfield she managed to get herself a job at Flowercraft on Lewes Road. K J had worked as a florist in Clementi and this seemed a good fit for her skills. She developed a great relationship with the then-owners and founders Eileen & Mike Giles and, at the same time, she studied floristry at Plumpton College in order to learn and adjust to European styles of floral arrangements. After five years K J moved to work at Plantscene on Sussex Road in Haywards Heath, which she clearly enjoyed: "I learnt so much there about business and professionalism. It really opened my eyes."

In May 2000 Khee Joon saw an opportunity that she couldn't resist as the owners of Lindfield shop, Country Charm, opposite the pond, decided to sell up. "By this time I knew I could run my own business and knew the pitfalls to avoid, so I went for it!" This was the birth of Floral Studio. It was never K J's intention to create a business with lots of staff; she always wanted it to be her business with customers who knew her.

"I really enjoyed being my own boss, especially at first, as I could chat to the customers as long as I liked!" K J clearly loves to meet and catch up with people and she considers this really important in a local florist. The generally held sales view that 'people buy from people' would seem to back this up. She found that she soon began to know what flowers her regulars liked and this relationship-building is what has created the excellent customer base she enjoys to this day.

Being a local shopkeeper is a very public occupation and when she started Floral Studio her daughter was at Oathall Community College. K J recalls Rachel-Kim's pride when her friends' mums said to her that they'd met her mother when they bought flowers in the village. Her eldest, Gordon, was at a bar in London when he met a





stranger and got talking to her. It turned out she lived in Lindfield and his mother was doing the flowers for this girl's wedding!

In December, after 15 years, Khee Joon made the difficult decision to move the business out of the small premises following a series of discussions regarding the lease with the landlords. But she clearly misses Lindfield terribly. Made worse by the fact that she and George moved out of Lindfield two years ago to North Chailey – where she now operates the business from. "I'm going to see how it goes," K J says. "It's not the same without a shop front but I still see plenty of people on my deliveries in and around Lindfield."

George retired last year and the couple would like to find more time to see their far-flung children. Gordon is in Australia, Dylan in London and Rachel-Kim is now based in Singapore. "But I'm always on FaceTime or WhatsApp to either my children or family back home; so I don't miss them too much." One thing she is looking forward to is the ability to accept lunch invitations from friends! Something that running a shop full time makes impossible. "That and not always having to be in a hurry," K J adds, quickly!



#### Chicken & potato casserole (serves 4)

- 1. In a small bowl melt 25g butter 30 sec.
- Cut 350g slender leeks into 2.5cm slices. Put into an ovenproof casserole and sprinkle over 1tsp of the butter. Cover and cook for 4 min or until soft.
- Cut 500g boned and skinned chicken (thighs are perfect) into fingers and add to the leeks. Cover and cook for 5 min, stirring once.
- Whisk 125g tub low-fat cheese with garlic and herbs and 1tsp cornflour into 150ml hot chicken stock until smooth. Add 50ml dry white vermouth or dry cider and stir into the casserole.
- 5. Thinly slice 450g peeled potatoes and arrange over the chicken. Stir 2tsp dried herbs into the remaining butter and drizzle over the potatoes.
- 6. Cover and cook on MEDIUM/50% for 20-25 min until the chicken is cooked and the potatoes tender.
- 7. Uncover and grill until the top is golden brown.

Do you really cook in your microwave from scratch using raw ingredients, not just reheating precooked food or that cold cup of coffee? With the cost of domestic fuel hitting the headlines, now is the time to rethink how we use this useful appliance in your kitchen.

So... rethink how you cook simple dishes, reread the book that came with your microwave and start saving money heating that big oven or using the hob. Make full use of the different power levels – think of them as turning the gas jet or oven temperature up or down. Make a start with these delicious dishes and I promise you, you will not be disappointed.

Cooking is on full power/HIGH unless otherwise stated and timings are for an 800 watt oven. Check your instruction book for other wattages; if in doubt always cook for less time, check the result and adjust accordingly.

#### Root vegetable bake (serves 2)

To serve 4, double the ingredients and cook for 15 min. Test result and cook further if needed.

- Put a good knob of butter into a small bowl and m/w 20 sec until melted. Stir in a handful of fresh breadcrumbs and mix lightly.
- Put a crushed garlic clove, 75ml whipping cream and 50ml vegetable stock into a jug and m/w 1 min. Season with pepper.
- Thinly slice 175g each of small parsnips, carrots and sweet potato. Layer in a shallow dish and pour the seasoned cream over the top.
- 4. Cover and cook on MED/HIGH/75% for about 10 min or until soft throughout.
- Sprinkle the breadcrumbs on top and grill until golden brown.

#### Bolognese sauce (serves 4)

May be frozen and/or reheated (on MED/HIGH). Serve with pasta, rice or as a filling for jacket potatoes.

- Put 1tsp oil into a large casserole and stir in 1 large finely chopped onion, 1 crushed garlic clove, 4 chopped streaky bacon rashers and 2 finely chopped carrots. Cover and cook for 5 min, stirring once.
- Stir in 450g lean minced beef, breaking it up with a fork. Cover and cook for 5min, stirring once.
- Stir in 150ml beef stock, 2-3tbs tomato puree and 1tsp dried herbs. Cover and cook for 10 min, then reduce power to MED/50% and cook 5-10 min, stirring once or twice, until the sauce is cooked.



### Neighbourhood Plan

The formal submission of the Plan under Regulation 15 of the Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012 was made by delivering it to the Neighbourhood Planning Officer at Mid Sussex District Council on the 12th December 2014.

This submission included the proposed Neighbourhood Plan, along with the Proposals Maps, Consultation Statement and Basic Conditions Statement.

In addition we had to supply a number of background evidence papers, which support the appropriate policies in the Plan. These included: Local Green Spaces in Lindfield Parish, Local Green Spaces in Lindfield Rural Parish and Areas of Townscape Character – Lindfield Buildings overview.

We also had to provide supporting papers in respect of the Consultation Statement and these included: Community Engagement Plan, Consultation activities and Consultation feedback.

These documents were submitted on behalf of both Lindfield Parish Council, who approved them for submission at its Extraordinary meeting on 4th December 2014, and Lindfield Rural Parish Council, who approved them for submission at its meeting on 1st December 2014.

We have now done all that we can do to progress

the plan, and Mid Sussex District Council now have to satisfy themselves that these documents meet the requirements of the regulations. Once that has been done, we will then be able to publish the documents on our websites.

However, it will be MSDC who will formally publish these documents under the next step, for a 6 week public consultation period. Details of the consultation period dates and how the various documents can be studied will be publicised by MSDC and should appear on their website and in the Mid Sussex Times. Once we know these details, we and the Rural Parish Council will also put them on our websites, together with links to the various documents.

### Street lights

The upgrade of West Sussex County Council's street lights in the village has been taking place. As stated in previous newsletters, the Parish Council is making a contribution in order to have better consistency in the village centre, particularly the Conservation Area, with the heritage style lights. You may have noticed that the contractors are actually installing standard columns but, in the roads for which heritage style lighting has been agreed, these are to be modified in due course with the addition of embellishments to the columns, swan neck brackets and heritage style lanterns.

#### Responsible financial officer / assistant clerk

The Parish Council will shortly be seeking to appoint a new member of the office staff in the combined role of Responsible Financial Officer and Assistant Clerk. At the time of writing, the details have not yet been confirmed but the post will be advertised on our website and noticeboard in Denmans Lane in due course.


