We are always on the lookout for more stories, events to promote and residents' personal stories to tell - so do please get in touch by 14th February.





School farm benefits from Rotary Club

Plans to improve the farm at Oathall Community College with new fencing and improved animal housing have been given a boost – thanks to the Cuckfield and Lindfield Rotary Club.

Members of the club have raised $\pm 2,000$ toward the improvements.

Last month 50 Oathall students, who attend the Young Farmers Club, along with Headteacher, Edward Rodriguez and Chair of Governors, Rowena Chalk were presented with a cheque from Rotary Club president, Jaime Wallden and vice-president, Karen Looker. Also present from the Rotary Club were Chris Jupp, chairman of youth activities and past president, John Davey. The Rotary Club is a long-standing supporter of the school and the farm.

Speaking at the presentation, John Davey told students: "The farm at Oathall is a very special resource and as students at this school you are given an exceptional opportunity to get involved with the farm and its activities. You will find that when you leave Oathall this gives you a unique experience which you can use in your future studies and careers."

Head of farm John Blackholly, said: "We are so grateful to the Rotary Club for this donation. The money will be used to improve the natural environment for our animals with better outdoor housing and fencing. Every



year we have visits from a wide range of community groups and this donation will also be used to improve the accessibility and environment for our visitors and so benefit the wider community."

There has been a farm at Oathall for more than 70 years. Students are involved in the day-to-day running of the farm which is also regularly used as a teaching resource. There is a thriving young Farmers' Club with over 100 members. The farm welcomes visitors and groups from the community and each year holds an open day in early spring. This year's event is on Sunday 30th April.

Walking therapy

There's nothing quite like getting out in the fresh air for a walk in the stunning Sussex countryside – it's the perfect way to help banish any winter blues.

And walking alongside fellow enthusiasts can make the experience even more enjoyable.

The Mid Sussex Ramblers always welcomes new members to enjoy its varied programme of walks.

Whether you're an experienced walker looking for new routes to explore, or a beginner keen to get started, then the Ramblers has something to offer.

Formed in 1973 the group is part of the national Ramblers, Britain's leading walking charity, and currently has more than 480 members.

Walks are arranged every Saturday, Sunday, and Tuesday throughout the year, on Bank Holidays, and occasionally other days in the week.

There are leisurely half day walks of 3 to 6 miles and, for the more energetic, all day walks of 9 to 11 miles. During the summer months there are also Wednesday evening walks (3 to 4 miles) and weekend walking breaks and coach outings with walks.

During the winter months the group holds indoor meetings in King Edward Hall, with illustrated talks, and social evenings in local pubs in the Mid Sussex area.

Why walk?

Former Ramblers' Chief Executive Tom Franklin writes: "Imagine if a pharmaceutical company invented a new 'wonder drug' which, if taken by the whole population, would cut coronary heart disease by over a third. People would be clamouring for it to be provided free on the NHS.

"But imagine if that drug could also reduce cases of osteoarthritis; dramatically cut rates of obesity, diabetes and cardiovascular disease; halve the rates of colon cancer among those most at risk; reduce levels of breast cancer and aid recovery among cancer suffers; reduce high blood pressure and cholesterol; cut by two-thirds the risk of strokes among highest-risk middle-aged men; and cut by a quarter the risk of dying of a heart attack among those who've already survived one attack.

"That drug already exists - it's called walking. If everyone did it, frequently and fast enough, people would live longer and happier lives."

One in four people in the UK now experiences mental health problems in the course of a year. But regular walking can reduce depression, stress and anxiety, and aid sleep.



Walks organised for February include an eight mile walk exploring Slaugham, Bolney and Warninglid including a pub lunch on the 7th, Newick to Isfield Circular (10 miles) on the 12th, a four mile 'Barcombe Spectacular Views' walk on the 25th and the eight mile Plumpton Circular walk on the 28th February.

SIMPLY GOOD FOOD

Leek and Rice Soup (Serves 4)

Using a large pan, gently fry 150g diced chorizo or bacon until golden brown. Remove with a slotted spoon. Add a small knob of butter to the pan with 3 thinly sliced leeks. Cook, stirring until just soft. Add 25g long grain rice (white or brown) and 850ml strong chicken or vegetable stock. Bring to the boil, cover and cook over low heat until the rice is tender - about 15 min. Add the juice of 1 large lemon, the diced chorizo/bacon and season to taste.

Vegetable Chowmein (Serves 2)

For a main dish, add 225g cooked prawns or some diced cooked chicken with the soy sauce.

Cut 4 young carrots into matchsticks, slice 50g green beans and 6 spring onions. Drain 227g can bamboo shoots. Heat 2tbs oil in a wok, toss in 1tbs sesame seeds and cook, stirring constantly, until just beginning to brown. Stir in the vegetables and cook, stirring constantly, until just soft. Add 4bsp soy or tamari sauce and 150g "straight to the wok" noodles. Cook until piping hot then serve immediately.

Why do we make new year resolutions – to stop eating chocolates, lose weight, exercise more etc etc? Why be so hard on yourself when it is cold and grey outside and post Christmas bills are landing on the door mat. Let's make a new resolution to be kind to ourselves and everyone else, just curl up with a good book and eat some very comforting food. We can worry about our waistlines when we shed the woolly jumpers!

Sausage Hotpot (Serves 4)

Gently fry 8 sausages in a deep fry pan (with a lid) until golden brown. Remove from the pan, leaving just a little fat. Stir in 2 thinly sliced onions, some crushed garlic and a diced red pepper. Cook, stirring , until just beginning to brown. Return the sausages to the pan plus a 400g can baked beans. Cover and cook over low heat for about 15 min, stirring once or twice. Add seasoning and serve with hot garlic bread.

Crunchy Celery & Apple Salad (Serves 4)

Whisk together 3tbs mayonnaise, 3tbs thick natural yogurt, 1tbs creamed horseradish and a little milk to make a creamy dressing. Thinly slice a head of celery and tip into a salad bowl, add 4 small red-skinned apples, cored and diced, a handful of walnut halves and a generous handful of watercress sprigs. Add the dressing and toss to combine. To make a main meal add diced Cheddar cheese and serve with hot crusty rolls

Butterscotch Pears (Serves 2)

Put 2tbs soft brown sugar, a good knob of butter and 2tbs golden syrup, honey or maple syrup into a shallow dish. Microwave HIGH for 1 min. Stir in 2tbs lemon juice and a handful of chopped walnuts or pecans. Cut 2 just-ripe dessert pears in half lengthwise, scoop out the core and peel. Arrange, cut side down, in the dish and spoon the sauce over the top. Cook on HIGH for 3-4 min, turning the fruit over once, or until the pears are soft. Serve piping hot with cream or yogurt.

Work starts at Wakehurst to help restore views

Wakehurst's gardeners have started work to thin out the trees and shrubs in Westwood Valley - the steep ravine running from the Water Gardens to Westwood Lake.

The three month project will see both the selective removal of trees and the heavy pruning of other trees and shrubs. Westwood Valley is part of the Asian Garden and houses a valuable collection of trees and plants that grow well in the wet, moist conditions of the Sussex Weald.

The initiative is part of a 15-year plan for Wakehurst that will see each area of the 558 acre estate edited, as in Westwood Valley, or intensified by more planting or created afresh with a completely new design.

Over the years Westwood Valley's vegetation has become extremely dense and there are now more than 3,500 trees in the area. The mature oaks lost their tops in the 1987 Great Storm and grew new branches lower down the trunks. The canopy tops have now regrown and it is the perfect time to remove the low branches, so the young trees and vegetation below can become healthier and grow into their natural shapes.

Cutting back will also open up the stunning views towards Westwood Lake that haven't been seen for 80 years.

New test available for pregnant women

Maximise your driver distance

Getting the maximum distance out of the driver is something everyone wants to achieve. Sometimes in the hope of doing this you might try to hit the ball too hard or swing back too far, but this doesn't actually always maximise your driver distance.

Maximum distance comes from hitting the ball out of the middle of the club and at the right angle of attack. Hitting the middle of the club requires a good set up first of all. You need to stand feet slightly wider than shoulder width to create a solid base and allow your arms to hang naturally when gripping the club. Being too tense will make it harder for you to swing correctly.

The angle of attack refers to the degree that the club head approaches the ball. For the driver you need a shallow angle of attack which promotes you hitting on the upswing. This will make the ball carry further and have less spin on it so it will also roll further. To create this shallow angle you need to position the ball forward in the stance and feel like you stay behind the ball when you hit.

Another important feature to maximising your driver distance is having a slight pause at the top of the backswing, this will help to allow you to complete a full backswing. It will also help you to keep a smooth tempo rather than try and swing too quick which will normally lead to the body swinging out of sequence.

Try this out next time you tee the ball up and see what results you get.

The Age of Bowie by Paul Morley

BOOK REVIEW

Paul Morley is a journalist and music writer who knew the career and the influence of David Bowie inside out.

This book is part biography, part meditation on the life of the rock star who died in 2016.

Some passages seem to be written in blank verse, echoing the style of David Peace's Red or Dead, by repeating the name 'David Bowie' with a thought connected to him, such as 'David Bowie - is never doing anything out of the blue'.

It is not a conventional 'start at birth and go onto death' style of writing, but an impressionistic combination of facts, memories and reflection.

He does miss some of the cultural impact of Bowie in the two key series of the last fifteen years, namely Life on Mars and Ashes to Ashes. This seems a strange omission. Yet this is a small fault in a major book, which does help us understand the sense of loss and still celebrates what remains of this extraordinary talent.

There was relief and elation from the Lindfield students, teachers and parents when it was confirmed that they had won by just two points from reigning champions Harlands. All the children performed admirably, reflecting the school values, particularly respect, enthusiasm and teamwork.





Maverick – Seven-year-old Maverick has been waiting for a new owner since October and would now desperately like a home without other pets or young children, where he can be the centre of attention.




